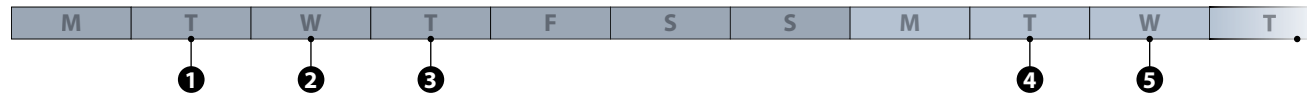


On Thursday, Winnebago County Sheriff Dick Meyers, Winnebago County State's Attorney Joe Bruscato and Winnebago County Coroner Sue Fiduccia announced the grisly discovery of bones belonging to two infants in a vehicle registered to Katie Stockton. Here is how the discovery unfolded and what will happen next:

**1 Tuesday, Aug. 11:** Following a lead that Katie Stockton has a car registered in her name in Illinois, Winnebago County detectives go looking for the car and find it in a South Beloit Police Department impound lot. The vehicle has been in the lot since Aug. 15, 2008.

**2 Wednesday, Aug. 12:** Winnebago County detectives obtain a search warrant to go through the car and discover two bags in the trunk containing what they believe are bones belonging to the bodies of two infants.

**3 Thursday, Aug. 13:** Coroner's office X-rays the bags and confirms that the bags contain bones belonging to two babies. Coroner Sue Fiduccia says the contents of the bags were not disturbed and will not be touched until a full examination can be performed.

**4 Tuesday, Aug. 18:** A forensic pathologist and forensic anthropologist will conduct a full examination of the bags' contents. DNA samples will be sent to the state crime lab. The examination could continue into Wednesday.

**5 Wednesday, Aug. 19:** Preliminary data could be ready for release, including how many bones were found and whether the babies suffered any trauma. Other findings, such as sex and age, may not be known for several weeks.
