

## Pay growth slow in metro area

Workers in Boone and Winnebago counties saw their compensation grow about 3.9 percent in 2007, slower than the national average. Manufacturing remained the biggest industry, but health care's payroll topped \$1 billion for the first time. Farm compensation was the highest since 2001, and governments continued to increase payrolls.
